In the first couple weeks of October a fisherman was found in a life raft 75km off the west coast of Vancouver Island around Tofino. The gentleman had been adrift for almost 2 weeks and was one of two fisherman that set off from Newport 200 km south of the life raft finding. The vessel and the captain have not been found. The captain was a man of 25 years experience. The 40 ft fishing craft apparently got sideways in a trough between two waves and capsized.

This event can certainly make one think. What if? Nah? The odds of that happening is quite remote. But, what if? We all think of MOB scenarios, flotation devices, PFD's, Epirbs, beacons, and life slings. Remember we have about 30 min or so before we start losing motor function and all of the above, assuming we have a vessel.

We all need to make that life raft decision. What's the cost? What's the odds? I mean really what are the odds?

Well, 5000 boats capsize a year. There are 800 deaths. Fifty major vessels are lost at sea yearly. If an aircraft is lost at sea, we hear about it for weeks. Lose a massive vessel, we don't hear much.

Tis a good time to check our service intervals on our safety devices. My life raft was a year overdue. I have a year on the Epirb


February 3 Communications Systems and Antenna considerations



Boating Under the Influence: Talk about it before it's too late

Let's talk about boating under the influence (BUI). Just because November is upon us and a lot of boats have been winterized, we continue to need to educate each other about this dangerous practice. America's Boating Channel™ BUI videos offer an excellent way in which to do this.

Check out the "Dispelling BUI Myths" video in Season Four that covers six major misconceptions about boating under the influence (BUI). It teaches viewers about unique dangers associated with boating while intoxicat-



ed and features law enforcement actions and penalties for conviction of BUI. In Season Five there is a video entitled "BUI Fatalities" that covers the most fundamental reason for not boating under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Viewers will learn of additional associated risks and receive tips for avoiding BUI, such as using a designated sober operator.



It's not too early to start planning your boat show booth. Have you considered using a computer or TV to play a loop of the many America's Boating Channel videos? It is an excellent way to draw people in to talk with you about safe boating through education and the opportunities your club offers.

In addition to YouTube, these professionally produced high-definition safe boating and boater education videos are available via the America's Boating Channel on-demand app on Roku, FireTV and, as of November 2023, Apple TV. America's Boating Channel is produced by the United States Power Squadrons® (USPS) under a grant from the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund administered by the U.S. Coast Guard.
















































With this NATO alphabet chart you will no longer use "M as in Mancy" during a support call with your mom, or while defusing a bomb.
